**Vikram**, can we get some "I'm going too fast" noises and comments from you?

4 SOMEWHERE DEEP INSIDE THE SHIP'S CIRCUITRY

SFX: Not sure what it sounds like in here, so I'm open to ideas! I'm picturing a kind of spooky interface. Crackling electricity as information flashes by, barren, echoey, enormous. Blue light (yes, I know it's audio, humor me), cold. Olivia's voice keeps moving, side to side, up, back, above, below, etc.

BOB

There you are! You've been hiding from me.....

144	OLIVIA I'm not hiding, I'm skulking.
145	BOB Not very well. I can see you; you're right there. Ish.
146	OLIVIA HIDING is about not being seen. SKULKING is about just barely being seen out of the corner of your foe's eye as a creepy, unexplained shadow.

148	OLIVIA Getting under your cheap, plastic casing, am I?

153	BOB Every one of them will get a good night's sleep tonight. I've cranked up the oxygen for energy and clarity, adjusted their wake-up music for a slow, genial arousal,

SFX: Door opens, Colin walks in, wanders around bridge looking for something. Moves papers, bubble wrap, etc. aside, looking. Colin: Hum, say things like "now, where ARE you?"

162 (muttering to himself) Sharpie sharpie sharpie, where the hell are you?

Pause.

191 How 'bout now?

COLIN

192 No. Should I?

BOB

193 It's weird that you're not.

Dangerously weird.

COLIN

194 (nervous now) One moment! Ah yes,

there it is.

BOB

195 What does it sound like to you?

COLIN

196 (covering the bases) Oh, ehhhhhhhh...
a sort of whistling, pinging, beeping,
warbling, musical, blaring ... train
wreck....? You know, I think it's my

tinnitus. Comes and goes.

BOB

197 Huh.

COLIN

198 Well. It's been lovely getting to know you. Off I pop to the kitchen for my

pen.

Hints of Albatros talking in the background.

BOB

199 I could bring her back for you.

COLIN

200 I beg your pardon?

BOB

The owner of that pen you're so keen to find. I can bring her back. In fact, Olivia could've too, all this time.

COLIN

You're not serious.

BOB

She's not that broken. Couple spare parts from the supply, little WD-90, quick jump start, she'd be good as new. Whaddya say?

COLIN

No. I mean...not now. I'd like to think about that.

BOB

You do that. And maybe think about why Olivia never made the same offer.

COLIN

Yes. That is curious....

SFX: Colin exits. Bob's alarm goes off again.

BOB

207 FINE.

SFX: sound of dialing phone, ringing. SOUTHERS voice answers on the other end of the line. Slightly crackly connection.

SOUTHERS

208 Bout goddamn time you checked in!

BOB

209 All righty, all righty, now!

SOUTHERS

We've got some catching up to do.
What's the status there?

BOB

211 Under control, bosserino. Under control.

SFX/ACTORS: Bit of a struggle on Southers' end, then TIBERIUS takes the phone.

TIBERIUS

Give me that! Good god, man, I remember the days when you crawled at my feet.

SOUTHERS

Long gone, Tyrantasaurus Wrecked.

TIBERIUS

214 What's the status on that wretched little gnome Olivia?

BOB

Y'all aren't real familiar with the term "under control," hey? I guess not, given the crazy situation I inherited up here.

TIBERIUS

216 Watch it, Bob. My reach is farther than you know. I'll make you pay-

In the middle of his threat, there's another struggle, this time with FELONIUS.

FELONIUS

217 Will you two wind bags shut the hell up and get to figuring out what happens next? Good god, that I ever let either of you idiots tell me what to do.

Felonius takes over the phone. Sounds of Tiberius and Southers bitch slapping one another in the background.

BOB

218 Sounds like the sequel to Lord of the Flies is working out real well.

FELONIUS

Don't concern yourself with what's happening here. Just make sure you get the Oz 9 to Galaphabinoid on schedule. Shut up! Stop fighting, I'm talking!

BOB

You have GOT to come up with a better name, Bossanova.

FELONIUS

We're working on it. Ozdyssey out.

Sounds of a three-way struggle for the phone, then it suddenly cuts off.

BOB

222 (over the intercom) Crew to the bridge, por favor. Step lively, now, y'all, I've got some good news!

6 NARRATORS' BRIDGE

Holy hells bells.

NARRATOR

That's going to be a problem.

N2

225 What do you reckon Galaphabinoid is?

OLIVIA

It's a planet.

ACTORS: Narrator and N2 react with great to Olivia's sudden arrival with great astonishment.

227 What ... you ...

OLIVIA

Wow. Requirements for the Ron Howard School of Expository Sciences have gone way down since my day.

229 You studied with The Ron?

NARRATOR

NOT REALLY IMPORTANT RIGHT NOW, TWO.
